## Commemorating 1916 'A Concert to Remember'

### A Concert to Remember

A "Grand Irish Concert" was due to take place in Clondalkin Library on 30th April 1916 in aid of the Clondalkin branch of the Gaelic League.

It never happened.

Three of the performers were either killed or arrested during the Rising a few days previously.

Clondalkin Library will honour the memory of these people with a celebratory concert featuring Irish music, dancing, readings and recitations.

exactly 100 years to the day of the original concert.
