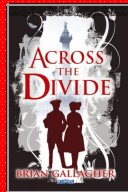

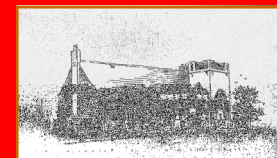

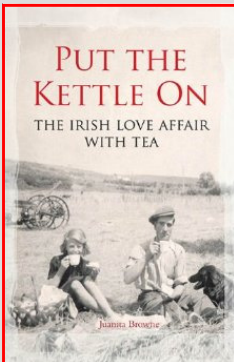

Poet and author Colm Keegan will facilitate this course which will cover areas of writing as diverse as poetry, memoir and writing for screen and theatre and plotting a novel.

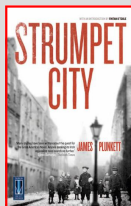
